Dear partners and colleagues,

This edition of the People in Need Georgia newsletter comes as the whole world is shaken by COVID-19. This pandemic has highlighted the inequalities within and between countries, but also brought inspiring examples of cooperation, solidarity, and creativity. At the time of writing, Georgia is globally recognized as one of the countries that has most successfully contained a potential public health crisis, through evidence-based policy and community action.

The PIN Georgia team rapidly adapted our approach to ensure we could continue our projects without risk to the public or colleagues, and meet the changing needs. In this newsletter you will read more about how PIN responded to COVID-19 pandemic by delivering essential hygiene and

protective equipment to vulnerable residents and staff of State institutions; provided expert guidance on legal and psychosocial questions raised by communities; and share information that keeps all of us safe.

Our colleagues worldwide have also been engaged in the fight against COVID-19, while continuing to provide urgent humanitarian assistance in fragile and conflicted-affected areas.

However, we believe that this initial response is just the first step. Like the rest of the world, Georgia is forecast to experience serious financial impacts from the pandemic. PIN is ready to support an economic recovery that is based upon inclusion, participation, and environmental protection, in order to build the resilience of Georgian communities to future shocks and stresses.

I would like to thank our donors and partners who support this important work, in particular the European Union, the Czech Development Agency and Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and SlovakAid.

Ensuring a disability-inclusive response to COVID-19

In May, People in Need Georgia in coordination with the Agency for State Care and Assistance For the (Statutory) Victims of Human Trafficking, successfully distributed personal protective equipment to boarding houses for people with disabilities in Dusheti, Martkopi and Dzevri. The distribution forms part of PIN's effort to ensure that the national COVID-19 response is disability-inclusive.

The provision of PPE is not only essential to reinforce preventive measures to promote health, hygiene and protection against COVID-19 but also in order to ensure that no one is left behind during this pandemic.
